

Ashok Khosla is chairman of Development Alternatives, a social enterprise that champions sustainable development through the innovation and delivery of technologies for creating rural livelihoods, of methodologies for managing the natural resource base and of designs for effective institutions. In 1972, Ashok established and headed the Indian Government's Office of Environment and was later Director, Infoterra in the United Nations Environment Programme. He has been advisor to government and international agencies and board member of WWF, IISD, SEI and other bodies. He is President of the Club of Rome and President of IUCN. In 2002 he was awarded the United Nations Sasakawa Environment Prize, in 2004 the Schwab Award for Outstanding Social Entrepreneur and in 2008 the OBE.
