

Martin Lees is Secretary General of the Club of Rome. After graduation from the European College of Brugge, he joined the OECD where he was responsible for programmes on Cooperation in Science and Technology and on Innovation and also for the design and launching of the “InterFutures Project”. He then served at the United Nations in several capacities including Executive Director of the Financing System for Science and Technology for Development and, in 1982, he was appointed Assistant Secretary General. He has also been responsible for several high level programmes of International Cooperation with China and established the China Council for International Cooperation on Environment and Development. He developed and implemented programmes of cooperation with the former Soviet Union as Director General of the International Committee for Economic Reform and Cooperation. He also served as Rector of the University for Peace of the United Nations, guiding its revitalization and launching eight Masters programmes on peace and security related issues.
